Thursday 21 November

Open science and bibliographic research

All Doctoral Candidates

This session will combine training and practical workshops on open science practices and bibliographic research.

Open science, which aims to provide free and open access to publicly funded research results, has evolved over the last twenty years from a militant movement initiated by researchers to a national strategy supported by the French Ministry of Higher Education and Research and research funders. Over and above the issues at stake, it is becoming an integral part of researchers' day-to-day practices, to guarantee the reproducibility and effectiveness of their research. Doctoral students today have a crucial role to play in implementing these principles and ensuring the success of this transition to a more open science.

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Bibliographic research is at the heart of all scientific research. Faced with the flood of information available and the diversity of ways of accessing research results, a good knowledge of the research tools available and their specific features is now essential for finding one's way around the scientific publication landscape.

Objectives of this training

- Identify the scientific literature search tools best suited to your research needs
- Master search methods to better target relevant results
- Open science: definition, components and challenges, identify the research practices that can be put in place to practice open science
- The open access scientific publication landscape: publication channels, points to watch: predatory journals and academic social networks
- Acquire the essential practices and methods for effective FAIR research data management
- Reproducibility: why and how?
